TIWA Privacy Policy, GDPR & Cookies

This privacy policy will explain how we use the personal data that we collect from you when you use our website www.tiwaproject.eu; www.ti

What data do we collect and how?

TIWA collects the Personal identification information (name, email address, phone number, etc.). You directly provide us with most of the data that we collect. We collect and process data when you contact us through the contact form, participate in the Learning Pills section and use or view our website via your browser's cookies.

How will we use and store your data?

TIWA collects your data so that we can email you with similar projects or relevant information to family businesses which we think you might like and use. If you agree, TIWA may share your data with our partner organizations.

We securely store your data at the AZ Ljudska Univerza Velenje which is the coordinator of TIWA project. The coordinator will keep your personal information data for a period up-to 5 years. Once this time period has expired, your data will be deleted.

What are your data protection rights?

Our organization would like to make sure you are fully aware of all your data protection rights. Every user is entitled to the following:

- The right to access You have the right to request TIWA for copies of your personal data.
- The right to rectification You have the right to request that TIWA correct any information you believe is inaccurate. You also have the right to request TIWA to complete information you believe is incomplete.
- The right to erasure You have right to request that TIWA erase your personal data, under certain conditions.
- The right to restrict processing You have the right to request that TIWA restrict the processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.
- The right to object to processing You have the right to object to TIWA's processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.
- The right to data portability You have the right to request that TIWA transfer the data that we have collected to another organization, or directly to you, under certain conditions.

What are cookies and how do we use them?

Cookies are text files placed on your computer to collect standard Internet log information and visitor behavior information. When you visit our website, we may collect information from you automatically through cookies or similar technology. For further information, visit: www.allaboutcookies.org. TIWA uses cookies to improve your experience on our website. We use them for the purposes of understanding how you use our website.

What types of cookies do we use?

There are number of different types of cookies, however, our website uses:

- Functionality cookies TIWA uses these cookies so that we recognize you on our website
- and remember previously selected preferences. These include what language you prefer and location you are in. A mix of first-party and third-party cookies are used.

- Advertising cookies – TIWA uses these cookies to collect information about your visit to our website, the content you viewed, the links you followed and information about browser, device and your IP address.

How to manage cookies?

You can set your browser not to accept cookies, and the above website tells you how to remove cookies from your browser. However, in a few cases, some of our website features may not function as a result.
